

Wanted!

A warrant has been issued for the arrest of CTBCP, *complacency towards blood collection procedures*. The subject is believed to be armed and dangerous, and a threat to the well-being of all patients. When last seen, CTBCP was wearing white and carrying a specimen collection tray, but is known to have many disguises. Among them are colorful smocks, lab jackets, and occasionally street clothes. But the subject is always seen carrying a wide variety of needles and tubes. At first sight, CTBCP appears identical to a properly trained and conscientious healthcare professional. However, upon close examination, positive identification can be made by observing the following characteristics:
